

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance is a beautiful expression of our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We are privileged at St. Augustine to have this devotion every first Tuesday of the month from 7:30 am to 12:00 pm, concluding with Benediction. In 1980, Pope Saint John Paul II wrote, "...the Church and the world have great need of Eucharistic adoration. Jesus waits for us in this sacrament of love. Let us be generous with our time in going to meet Him in adoration and contemplation full of faith. And let us be ready to make reparation for the great faults and crimes of the world. May our adoration adoration never cease."

To make this possible, we need two adorers for each hour as Jesus in the Monstrance cannot be left alone at any time during exposition. Please sign up for an hour to adore the Lord. The sign-up sheet can be found in the Vestibule of the Church. Venite Adoremus.

Meet Carlo Acutis... First Millennial Saint?

The weekend of April 19, 20, and 21 we will have the Eucharistic Miracles collection of Carlo Acutis on display at Saint Augustine Parish Center. Carlo, who died at age 15 of leukemia, was beatified on October 10, 2020, at Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi, in Assisi, Italy. Carlo was drawn to Jesus and Mary at a very young age and began putting this exhibit together when he was only one year old. After completing it, he was struck with cancer and died in 2006 at the age of 16. This exhibition has been shown at the Vatican and dozens of countries around the world. The exhibit will be in St. Augustin Parish Center on Friday, April 19, for our school children and for all who wish to come. The Parish Center will be open Saturday, April 20, noon until after the 4:00 pm mass. And again on Sunday, April 21, before and after all Masses. Come and see this wonderful display of Miracles to increase your Faith and Love in Christ Jesus. Jesus Christ is truly present in the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity that is available for you to receive at every Holy Mass and Communion Service. Say like Saint Thomas "My Lord and My God." Blessed Carlo Acutis, pray for us and our families.
