Our next training session will be held at the **Maloney Center** at 1200 South Shelby Street, Louisville, KY on **Saturday April 28** from **9:00 AM until 3:00 PM**, with a working lunch provided.

The training is free and open to anyone who is either interested in, or currently ministering to, jail populations in the many counties served by the Archdiocese of Louisville, however, pre-registration is required.

The Call

I remember the day so clearly. It was March 17, 2011, the feast of St. Patrick, when Archbishop Kurtz called me in the morning and told me that he was sending me to Holy Name of Mary and St. Augustine parishes in Marion County. It was a happy/sad moment. Happy because I knew that the parishes in Marion County are a great place for a priest to serve, and sad because I had grown to love the people at St. John parish and Annunciation parish, where I had been for twelve years. It was very hard to leave them to come to a new place.

Now the day has come again. Archbishop Kurtz called me with the news that he is sending me to serve as the next pastor of Holy Trinity and Holy Name parishes in Louisville effective June 20, 2018. It is a happy/sad moment. It is happy because both parishes are a great place for a priest to serve. But it is also sad because I have come to love you. Marion County is the place of my roots from when the Bowling family first came to Kentucky in the early 1800's. I'm a country boy at heart with a love for the land and the people here. I have cherished my time with you and had hoped for more time to grow in life and ministry with you. But the call has come and my time here is drawing to an end with a new beginning just ahead of me. Still, it will be very hard to leave and go to a new place.

The time has also come for our beloved Fr. Michael Martin. Archbishop Kurtz has called him to serve as the next administrator of Holy Trinity in Fredericktown and Holy Rosary in Manton. Our parishes have a great reputation for training priests to become pastor, and even though Fr. Michael is still a new priest, he has shown pastoral zeal and has been a quick learner. The people in "the burg" will be well served by him and will love him too.

It is good to remember that everything belongs to Jesus himself. We are stewards for a time, and then the time comes to hand-over the stewardship to someone else. We plant, and another harvests. This is literally true since just last summer I planted asparagus, red raspberries, and black berries in the rectory back yard.

I am also pleased to announce that Fr. Mark Hamilton will become the next pastor of St. Augustine and Holy Name of Mary parishes. He currently serves as pastor of St. Martha parish in Louisville. Fr. Mark grew up in Springfield at St. Dominic parish. Also, the soon to be Fr. David Farrell will become the next Associate Pastor of our parishes. He is currently finishing his studies at St. Meinrad Seminary.

I am confident of several things as we prepare in the coming months for the transition of priests. Our parishes have a great reputation for loving their priests. And I have felt greatly loved by you! I love you too. I'm sure that Fr. Mark and Fr. David will be warmly received and loved by you. And I know they will give their very best in priestly ministry here with you. I owe a huge debt of gratitude to our wonderful pastoral team. We have the best staff in the Archdiocese so I have great confidence that the ministries of our parishes will continue to grow and flourish in the years to come. Please know how proud I am of YOU for the way you have been good stewards of the ministry of Jesus Christ in our parishes. You have accomplished much here. And yet there is much to be done to build up the work of the church. May the Lord who has begun a good work in you bring it to completion.
